Description of alleged Breach: Without planning permission, the construction of oyster trestles with the associated activity of their maintenance and purpose of cultivating and farming of oysters on the land on the Foreshore of Whitstable beach.

The Planning Inspectorate references:- APP/J2210/C/183209297; 3209299; 3209300

The Council has received appeal correspondence dated the 14th August 2018 from the appellant that included a submission that the oyster trestles do not constitute Schedule 2 Columns 1(c) development as an intensive livestock installation.

The Council is prepared to accept that the development does not fall under Schedule 1 or Schedule 2 development as described in column 1 and 2 of the Town and Country Planning (Environmental Impact Regulations) 2017 to be an intensive fish farming operation.

Canterbury City Council will not therefore proceed to pursue this point at appeal.
